### **K-6 MISSIONS PROJECT**

The K-6<sup>th</sup> grade students will be partnering on a few projects with Allow the Children ministry this year. These projects include collecting books for a Christian school in Ghana; raising money for school supplies for Nepali children; and raising money for work projects for the blind and deaf in Burundi, Africa. This partnership will give the students an opportunity to minister to children that have very little and have not heard about Christ. TCS students are encouraged to earn money or give from their piggy banks as a real gift from

their hearts. The projects provide a real opportunity for young lives at TCS to impact children around the world for God's glory and His kingdom. The projects will be introduced to the students during chapels this month.
